The cardiac physiology department caters for patients of all ages from Cornwall to Cheltenham and about 2 years ago we underwent a refurbishment within the department. We now

At the same time the Children's Hospital have been supplying a wide range of documents to assist the Review, and welcomed them here in the autumn to see our clinical services.

The Review team tell us that they have already received over 250 responses, interviewed 40 fami-

We look forward to the Review team helping us better understand how we have lost the trust of a small number of families, how we learn from this and what we need to put right.

## An update from Ward 32

I had better start by introducing myself, I am Zoe Trotman and have been the Ward Sister on the cardiac ward for about 6 months. I am usually a sister on PICU so will seem familiar to many of you, but have joined the ward to cover Sarah who is on maternity leave. We have had 6 new nurses join us just before the winter (Jo, Maddy, Emily, Jo, Christie & Claire) and a new nursing assistant called Kasia (many of you will know Kasia from PICU too). Several of our new starters have been here as students and loved it so much they came back once qualified, but they have all settled in really well and are a valuable part of our team. It has been a busy Winter on Ward 32. We have opened an additional bed so now have the facility to look

after 17 patients, with up to 5 of these being in our HDU area. This has enabled us to move children out of Intensive Care more quickly once they are well enough. The feedback from having the ability to put most patients, even just for a night, on HDU has been amazingly positive both for patients and their parents as it acts as a step between PICU and the Ward.

Several of our patients and families have been busy raising fantastic amounts of money which they have donated to the Ward. This has meant I have purchased double sofa bed which can be used for parents if they are admitted as emergencies so they can at least get some sleep. We are also busy purchasing some brilliant new toys, IPads and

sensory lights that can be used by the children and

babies either by their bed or in the play room. Many of you will know and love our "Pink Sit in Car", which has been a firm favourite with so many patients and has travelled miles, up and down the ward, down to x ray or ECHO and back, with children sitting in it royally waving whilst their parents push them up & down, up & down, up & down!! It has finally worn out so with these generous donations we have purchased a couple of newer models...So a very big thank you.
