I would like to make a Freedom of Information Request please. I would like to request the following:

1. What security seals or tamper-evident products are currently used by the Pharmacy department, and what are they used for?

The Pharmacy department currently use Envoseal number tags to seal Controlled Drug bags & medication transported to wards.

2. How many are used each year?

The Trust uses 13 x1000 packs per year.

3. What is the annual cost for these items?

The annual cost is £794.67 excluding VAT.

4. I would also like to know where the trust purchases these products from, i.e. is it direct from a supplier or from the NHS Supply Chain?

The Trust purchases these products directly from supplier.

5. Who is responsible for purchasing this product?

The Pharmacy department is responsible for purchasing this product.
