Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trusts response is as follows:

- 1. How many patients died within hospital while awaiting the start of a NHS Continuing Healthcare care and support package in the financial years 2016/17, 2015/16 and 2014/15? Please could I have this information broken down by financial year?**

Where the figures are fewer than 5, this has been denoted by \*\*. Where numbers are low we have considered that there is the potential for the individuals to be identified from the information provided, when considered with other information that may also be in the public domain. In our view disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1. Therefore under **Section 40(2)** of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, we will not be disclosing this information at this time. Section 40 is the exemption for personal information.

- 2. How many patients in the last four financial years have waited more than a) one week b) one month to receive a care and support package after being found eligible for NHS Continuing Healthcare? Please could I have this information broken down by financial year for the years 2016/17, 2015/16 and 2014/15?**

- 3. What was the longest wait between a patient being found eligible for NHS Continuing Healthcare and receiving a care and support package in the financial years 2016/17, 2015/16 and 2014/15? Please could I have this information broken down by financial year?**
