Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

1. What type of equipment do you generally use to recover a patient from the floor after a fall (when there is no suspicion of fracture or spinal injury)?

Depending on patient's location, a mobile or ceiling hoist, or the Hoverjack is used. If the patient has had a comprehensive assessment and has no serious injury, the Trust would also encourage them to get up by themselves without use of equipment.

2. When was this equipment introduced in your policy on impatient falls?

Hoists have been used since the introduction of the Manual Handling Operations Regulations in 1992. The equipment was introduced in UHBristol's policy of impatient falls in 1995.

The Hoverjack was purchased in 2012 and has been in use since 2013.

3. What type of equipment did you use for this purpose before the current equipment?

Before the Manual Handling Operations Regulations, manual lifts were taught to healthcare students to move people or people were lifted by using a canvas and poles.
